


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## DELTA, DELTA, WHAT IS THAT?



All you need are sturdy white paper plates and Sharpie markers

The Fraternity Education Chairman tells the players to put their paper plate on their head.

Then the F. E. Chairman will give a series of instructions for the players to draw on their paper plates (that are on their heads) without looking. Lots of laughs!

Here are the instructions:

1. Draw a HEART in the middle of your paper plate and add a smiley face
2. Draw a gavel for the President/Immediate Past President
3. Draw P-E for President-Elect
4. Draw a \$ for the Treasurer
5. Draw a paper and pencil for the Secretary
6. Draw a cell phone for committee members
7. Write the word zoom for staying connected
8. Draw a triangle for Membership
9. Draw lips for a hug and kiss
10. Draw a star at the pointed bottom of the HEART
11. Put the abbreviation for Alpha Delta Kappa on the right outside of your HEART for staff at Headquarters
12. Draw a BOW at the top of the HEART to bring us all together.

After these steps have been given, let everyone look at their masterpieces.

Then have players count up how many points they received by following this rubric:

3 points if the HEART touches the rim of the paper plate.

3 points if your HEART actually is a heart-shape with a point.

3 points for your happy face..

2 points each of the following items: gavel, PE, \$, paper and pencil, zoom, Δ, lips.

5 points for the star at the pointed bottom of the HEART.


5 points if your BOW is on the top, middle of the HEART (not off to the side),

add another 5 points if you wrote AΔK instead of ADK.

Finally add 2 points if your creation brings a smile to your face







## **SANTA CLAUS AROUND THE WORLD - Narration**

Sandy McAlpin, AZ Gamma

Most Americans tend to think of Santa Claus as the jolly man in the red suit with a sack full of toys to deliver to children around the world on Christmas.

But the Santa you see in American movies and on Coca-Cola bottles is only one version of a mythical being who either rewards or punishes children and gives out gifts around Yuletide. Here's how Santa Claus is portrayed in 13 countries around the world.

### **Narration - Game Answers - May Be Used With or Without PowerPoint Presentation**

#### **Father Christmas - #5 United Kingdom**

Certain traditions are just a natural part of the British Christmas: Yorkshire pudding and turkey on the Christmas table, kids pulling Christmas crackers, and Father Christmas wearing green.

Although you will see the more popular, red-suited version of Santa on Christmas in the UK, the traditional British Father Christmas wears a hooded green cloak, a wreath of holly or ivy, and carries a staff. His appearance, like many Christmas traditions, is rooted in pagan mythology.

In pop culture, he resembles the Ghost of Christmas Present in Charles Dickens' "A Christmas Carol."

#### **Pere Noel - #2 France**

While his name may just be French for Father Christmas, Père Noël has his own Christmas traditions.

He wears a long red cloak instead of a red suit, and children leave their shoes by the fireplace hoping that they will be filled with goodies after mass on Christmas Eve. Père Noël also traditionally travels with a not-so friendly companion, "the whipping father," who spansks any children who have not behaved well throughout the year.

#### **Ded Moroz (Father Frost) - #7 Russia**

Ded Moroz, is a figure of Slavic mythology, often depicted as a wizard or demon. Traditionally, he would punish naughty children by kidnapping them, but this darker part of Ded Moroz's personality has softened over the years.

Now, on New Year's Eve, he travels all over the Slavic region, mainly in Russia and Ukraine, carrying gifts for children with his cheerful companion, the Snow Maiden.

### **Sinterklaas - #13 Netherlands**

Sinterklaas is the Dutch version of Santa Claus who most resembles St. Nicholas, the patron saint of children and inspiration for the modern Santa Claus legend.

Sinterklaas comes riding into town on a white horse, wearing a tall, red bishop's hat and a jeweled staff. He knocks on doors and brings gifts to good children, while his companion, Grumpus, rattles chains at naughty children and threatens to kidnap them.

### **Christkind or Christkindl - #10 Austria, Switzerland & Germany**

Christkind or "Christ Child" is the benevolent (usually female) gift-bringer who leaves presents for good children on Christmas Eve, much like her more famous counterpart, Santa Claus. She makes appearances to Lutheran families in Germany, Austria, Czech Republic, and the Slovakian region, and usually appears wearing a crown and long, curly blonde hair.

Christkind's angelic appearance and peaceful persona is derived from baby Jesus Christ himself, and comes from the Protestant tradition that Jesus, instead of a mythological creature like Santa or Father Frost, leaves behind presents on Christmas.

Every year, the city of Nuremberg in Germany chooses a child to play the part of the Christkind during the holiday market and celebration known as Christkindlmarkt.

### **Tomte or Julomten - #1 Sweden**

Tomte or Jultomten is a creature based in Swedish folklore. Traditionally a dwarf-like being with the appearance of a garden gnome, the Tomte guards farmhouses from bad luck. Although he was originally associated with the devil, the Tomte legend has in modern times become associated with Santa Claus.

On Christmas, an adult family member will dress up as Jultomten — complete with a face mask, and ask "are there any good children who live here?" before distributing his sack of presents.

### **Los Reyes Magos - #12 Spain**

In Spain, good children are not only visited by one, but three jolly figures who disseminate presents on El Dia de Reyes, the day that the three wise men finally reached baby Jesus on January 6.

In the days leading up to El Dia de Reyes, children in Spain, Mexico, and other Hispanic countries will magi, Melchor, Gaspar, or Baltasar. asking for gifts. That night, children leave out sweets for the magi and hay for the camels they ride on, and place their shoes where the magi will spot them. The next day, the offerings will be replaced by presents.

### **Joulupukki or Yule goat - #8 Finland**

Joulupukki, also known as the Yule goat, has been nicknamed the Finnish Santa. Before globalism naturally combined traditional Scandinavian customs with modern-day Santa Claus, the Yule goat was a malevolent spirit associated with the Norse god Odin who knocked on doors and demanded gifts and leftovers from the Yuletide feasts.

Nowadays, the Yule Goat still goes around to each house, but will instead inquire, “Are there any well-behaved children here?” and hand out presents. He drives a sleigh pulled by reindeer that does *not* actually fly. Modern Yule goats are usually made out of straw.

### **Tió de Nada - #11 Catalonia**

As perhaps the most fun-loving tradition on this list, Tió de Nadal is a log with a painted-on smiley face who defecates presents.

In the Catalonian region of Spain, children place Tió de Nadal under the Christmas tree and "feed him" nuts and dried fruit in the days leading up to Christmas, while simultaneously keeping him warm under a blanket.

On Christmas Eve, the children beat poor Tió with sticks and sing a rather graphic song about bodily functions. The next morning, the children will find that Tió de Nadal has pooped out a pile of gifts and sweets.

### **Julenissen - #3 Norway**

The Nissen or Julenissen in Norwegian folklore are very similar to the Swedish Jultomten. Known as Christmas pixies or Christmas elves, the Julenissen were traditionally barn devils who would act as spirit guardians over farms.

Nowadays, Julenisse comes from the North Pole and give gifts to little children on Christmas. Unlike Santa, Julenisse wears grey clothes and usually has a grey beard instead of a white one.

### **Yule Lads - #9 Iceland**

The Yule Lads are 13 mischievous Icelandic elves — who instead of making toys in Santa's workshop — play tricks on children. Pottasleiki for instance, will steal your leftovers, while Gryla — the mother of the 13 Yule Lads — will kidnap you if you have behaved badly.

During the 13 nights leading up to Christmas, Icelandic children place their shoes by the windowsill in the hopes that one of the 13 Yule Lads will leave them small gifts or candies. Misbehaved children will instead receive rotten potatoes in their shoes.

### **La Befana - #4 Italy**

Long before the man in the red suit was bringing toys to children on Christmas, La Befana, a good-natured witch who flies around on a broomstick, was doing the same for good children in Italy. She has been a part of Italian folklore since the 8th century.

According to the story, the three wise men came upon La Befana's house on Christmas Eve when they were journeying to see baby Jesus. She gave the wise men shelter and they asked her to join them to visit the Christ child. She declined, but then later changed her mind and tried to catch up with the magi.

However, she never found her way to Bethlehem, and now every night on the Eve of the Epiphany on January 5, she flies over Italy and gives toys and candy to good children, while leaving coal for the naughty ones.

### **Santa Claus - #6 United States**

The tradition of Santa that Americans know and love, with a red suit, long white beard, jolly laugh, and sack full of presents, can find its origins in dark pagan traditions that mark the middle of winter, as well as Christian legends of the third century monk known as St. Nicholas. His image was ingrained in our traditions almost one hundred years ago when he was first drawn for an advertisement for Coca Cola.

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

Two weeks prior to your monthly meeting, the Secretary emails a roster of chapter members in alphabetical order to each member. The Fraternity Education Chairman phones the first member on the list to “chat” and catch up on how she is doing. At the end of the conversation, the FE Chairman explains this game and then reads her the following statement. Tell her before reading it that you can only repeat it once! Read:

**“Ambitious amazing Agnes took action and arranged for active chapters while accumulating miles in her automobile.”**

The FE Chairman asks that person to phone the next person on the list, “chat” then share the statement she had heard with that sister. Then that person will phone the next sister on the list and so on...The last person on the roster calls the FE Chairman and gives her the final version of the statement.

### PROGRAM DURING CHAPTER MEETING

The FE Chairman shares a little history of the “Telephone Game.”  
 In ancient Florence, it was called the “game of the ear.”  
 In England, the game has been called “Russian Scandal, and Russian Gossip.”  
 In the North America, it has been known as “Telephone.”  
 Other names in the US were “Broken Telephone, Gossip, and Rumors.”

The main purpose of the game is for the amusement of the players. However, there are additional benefits for those playing.

- Clearly shows how small misconceptions can make a big difference
- It’s fun, generates laughs, and helps the group relax
- Develops active listening skills
- Helps understand the impact of gossip
- Involved all of us as we connected with our AΔK sisters!!!

## WREATH GAME adapted from Pam Coyne & Helen Foster, Alaska Alpha

*All you need are sturdy white paper plates and Sharpie markers*

*The Fraternity Education Chairman tells the players to put their paper plate on their head.*

*Then the F. E. Chairman will give a series of instructions for the players to draw on their paper plates (that are on their heads) without looking. Lots of laughs!*

*Here are the instructions:*

1. *Draw a wreath in the middle of your paper plate.*
2. *Add a string of pearl garland on your wreath.*
3. *Draw these (8) items on your wreath: gavel (president), heart (sisters that care), dollar sign (altruism), pencil/pen (secretary), violet (flower), the letter K (guard on your badge), Globe (world understanding), and apple (educators)*
4. *Draw a BOW at the top of the wreath. (Leadership)*
5. *Draw a bird nest with 2 baby birds (Sisters)*
6. *Put the abbreviation for Alpha Delta Kappa on the right side of your wreath  
(Headquarters)*
7. *Draw some pine cones on your wreath. (longevity)*
8. *Draw some berries on your wreath. (new chapters/growth)*

*After these steps have been given, let everyone look at their masterpieces.*

*Then have players count up how many points they received by following this rubric:*

1. *3 points if the wreath touches the rim of the paper plate..*
2. *3 points if your wreath is a round circle.*
3. *3 points for your garland of pearls on the wreath..*
4. *2 points each for each of any 8 items that are actually ON the wreath.*
5. *5 points if the nest has 2 birds INSIDE the nest.*
6. *5 points if your BOW is on the top of the wreath (not off to the side),*
7. *another 5 points if you have more than two pine cones, and*
8. *10 points if your wreath **LOOKS LIKE a WREATH!***
9. *5 points if the abbreviation of Alpha Delta Kappa is on the right side of the wreath,*
10. *add another 5 points if you wrote AΔK instead of ADK.*

*Possible score 60. The player with the most points should receive a really awesome prize.*
